White Code – Rules of Conduct on the Ski Trail

- 1. CONSIDERATION FOR OTHERS Every skier and snowboarder (hereinafter referred to as "skier") is obliged to behave in a way that does not endanger life, health or property, or cause damage to himself or others.
- 2. CONTROLLING SPEED AND DRIVING STYLE Every skier must have an overview of what is ahead. Every skier must adapt his riding and speed to the nature and condition of the ski trail and his abilities and possibilities, the terrain, weather and snow conditions, as well as the number of skiers on the ski trail.
- 3. CHOOSING THE DIRECTION OF DRIVING A skier is obliged to choose the direction of riding in such a way that he does not endanger the skier riding in front of him. A skier riding behind another skier is obliged to maintain sufficient distance to leave the skier in front free space for the direction and manner of riding.
- 4. OVERTAKE Overtake can be done from the right or left, so that the skier being overtaken has sufficient space for the direction and manner of skiing.
- 5. ENTRY TO THE SKI RUN AND STARTING AFTER STOPPING A skier who enters the ski run or wants to continue skiing after stopping must make sure that no other person is approaching from above or below, so as not to endanger himself or others.
- 6. STOPPING AND STANDING A skier must not stop and stand on narrow and obscured parts of the ski run without reason. A skier who has fallen must leave such a place as quickly as possible.
- 7. ASCENT AND DESCENT A person ascending or descending the ski run must use the edge of the ski run.
- 8. RESPECTING SIGNS AND INSTRUCTIONS Every skier must follow the signs on the ski slope and follow the rules of conduct on the ski slope and follow the instructions of the ski slope operator.
- 9. PROVIDING ASSISTANCE In the event of an accident on the ski slope, every skier is obliged to provide assistance according to their abilities and possibilities and immediately notify the ski slope operator and/or the Mountain Rescue Service and/or another authorized person (ski service, public administration body) of the accident, and to remain at the scene of the accident until assistance is provided by an authorized employee of the operator and/or the Mountain Rescue Service.
- 10. SAFETY OF SKI EQUIPMENT A skier may use ski equipment only in a condition in which the manufacturer guarantees safety when using the product and is secured against spontaneous release of the ski or other component of the ski equipment.
- 11. SPECIAL SAFETY A skier under the age of 15 is obliged to protect his head on the ski slope with a properly fastened protective helmet.
- 12. PROOF OF IDENTITY If an accident occurs on the ski slope, each participant or witness to the accident is obliged to prove basic personal data to the Mountain Rescue Service, the ski service, a public authority or an employee of the operator.
- 13. ENTRY TO THE SKI SLOPE During operating hours, a person other than the skier and the person providing assistance to the injured person may enter the ski slope only with the consent of the operator. Before and after the operation of the transport facilities, entry to the ski slopes and ski slopes is prohibited there is a risk of injury from snowmaking cables and from machines preparing the slopes, especially winches with an unwound rope!
- 14. ORGANIZED ACTIVITY (SKIING/SNOOBORDING INSTRUCTIONS) a person who organizes an activity on a ski slope is obliged to ensure that a person under the age of fifteen wears reflective safety clothing or visibly placed reflective safety elements.
- 15. First skiing/snowboarding instruction First skiing/snowboarding instruction (i.e. instruction in which the skier does not use lifts or transport equipment and the instruction is carried out by repeatedly climbing the ski slope on foot) must be carried out away from unsuitable places where they could cause a collision with skiers.

16. ADVERTISING AND BUSINESS PURPOSES ON THE SKI SLOPES – Without the operator's consent, it is prohibited to use ski slopes, ski routes and ski areas for advertising purposes (e.g. placing sales stands, advertising equipment, etc.). Without the operator's consent and the relevant permits, it is prohibited to carry out business or other gainful activity

Every visitor to the resort is obliged to familiarize themselves with these principles and general instructions for behavior on the ski slopes. By entering the ski slope and/or boarding the resort's mountain transport facilities, these principles and instructions become binding for everyone.
